Do 'cool' exterior walls save energy?

According to a study by scientists at Berkeley Lab,'cool' exterior walls can save as much or more energy than 'cool' roofsin many places. The study modeled several types and ages of homes, retail stores, and office buildings in cities across California and the U.S.

What materials absorb heat?

Thermal mass --commonly concrete, brick, stone, and tile. These materials absorb heat from the sunlight during the heating season and also absorb heat from warm interior air during the cooling season.

What is the difference between solar thermal collector and Trombe wall?

Whereas the solar thermal collector, Trombe Wall is able to convert 70%-80% of the suns radiation to heat, meaning, it is far more energy efficient and its heat production is powerful. Another passive collector-distributor Trombe Wall system was built in 1970, in Montmedy, France.

Do cool walls reflect solar energy?

Lower-performance cool walls should reflect at least 40% of solar energy, while higher-performance cool walls should reflect at least 60%. There are many light-colored cool paints in local home supply stores for creating cool walls.

Does a cool wall absorb or reflect sunlight?

An average wall that is not cool absorbs 75% of sunlight(as it reflects only 25%). However, cool walls reflect more sunlight. Light-colored walls are coolest, but pigments that reflect the invisible half of sunlight and pigments that fluoresce can be used to make cool paints in a wide range of colors.

How does a 20 x 35 wall work?

The 20- by 35-foot wall uses concreteto store and distribute heat for com-fortable working conditions during winter. During the summer, when the sun is higher in the sky, almost all sunlight reflects off the glazing to keep the building's interior relatively cool.
