How GGGI & KOICA are implementing the Taveuni solar PV project?

GGGI and KOICA signed a Letter of Intent in May 2017, indicating strong mutual interest in implementing the Taveuni solar PV project. Carry out a full feasibility study for a 1.5 MW solar PV project on Taveuni. The kick-off for the study was realized in November and the study will be finalized at the end of June 2018.
