

What's new in Hong Kong's 'large-scale solar farms'?

Commenting on the project, Binnie's Director of Projects Justin Searle says: 'The development of large-scale solar farms is new to Hong Kong and it's exciting to be at the forefront of several new initiatives, including floating solar on reservoirs and also land-based systems on closed landfills.'

What is solar energy used for in Hong Kong?

In Hong Kong, the primary use of solar energy is to provide hot water for facilities with heating demand or to generate electricity directly. Some small-scale photovoltaic and wind systems have been installed in remote areas to generate nominal electrical power for lighting and on-site data recording equipment.

How long does it take to build a solar farm in Hong Kong?

The planned construction period is about 18 months, commencing in Q1 2025. Can solar farms help Hong Kong transition to a low-carbon future?

This initiative, with the full backing of the Environment and Ecology Bureau and the Environmental Protection Department (EPD), not only provides a sustainable, low-carbon energy solution but also underscores the vast potential for similar solar farms across Hong Kong, supporting the city's transition to a low-carbon future.

Where are FPV pilot systems utilised in Hong Kong?

Utilisation of generated renewable energy The renewable energy generated by the three FPV pilot systems in Hong Kong is fully utilised by nearby WSD facilities, namely Shek Pik Raw Water Pumping Station, and the air compressor houses of Plover Cove Reservoir and Tai Lam Chung Reservoir.

What is FPV anchoring in Hong Kong?

Whilst innovations in solar panel technologies are largely in the hands of the research and development departments of specialised manufacturers, a particular area for innovation which is more specific to Hong Kong is the FPV anchoring system which must ensure that the solar arrays are securely held in place under typhoon conditions.
