

How do lead acid batteries store energy?

Lead acid batteries store energy by the reversible chemical reactions shown below. The overall chemical reaction is: $Pb + PbO_2 + 2H_2SO_4 \rightleftharpoons 2PbSO_4 + 2H_2O$ At the negative terminal the charge and discharge reactions are: $Pb + SO_4^{2-} \rightleftharpoons PbSO_4 + 2e^-$
